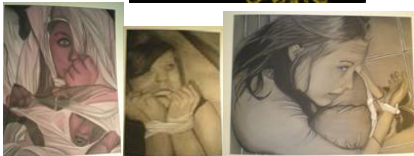


## Taylor's Art Department is Recognized (again!) at the NATIONAL level.

## STAMP OUT HUNGER WEEK At Taylor High this week!

This week is full of activities to build knowledge about hunger in our city and our world.

**Monday** - there will be 32 students volunteering their day to the following organizations in Over-the-Rhine: Memorial, Inc., Our Daily Bread, Free Store Food Bank, and Peaslee Child Care Center. The students were picked based on an application process that included writing an essay on how this experience will impact them.

**Wednesday** - students will begin a 30 hour famine to show their support to those people who go hungry each and every day. Students are asked to collect \$30 in donations in order to participate.

**Thursday** - The culminating activity will be "Filling their Bowls." This is a soup supper held in the Taylor HS cafeteria from 6-7:30pm. EVERYONE is invited. The cost is \$5 which includes soup, bread and a beautifully hand-crafted bowl created by a Taylor student!

\*All proceeds from the famine and soup supper benefit the Over-the-Rhine/Cincinnati FreeStore, Our Daily Bread Soup Kitchen, Memorial Inc. and the Peaslee Community Center and Daycare.





## Prudential Honors Taylor Senior

All public and private middle level and high schools in the county, as well as all Girl Scout councils, county 4\_H organizations, American Red Cross chapters, YMCAs and Volunteer Centers, were eligible to select a student or member for a local Prudential Spirit of Community Award this past November. More than 7,500 Local Honorees were then reviewed by state-level judges, who selected State Honorees and Distinguished Finalists based on criteria such as personal initiative, creativity, effort, impact and personal growth. Picked as a state honoree, was Stacey Ward, a senior at Taylor High School. She created a school tutoring program that pairs academically struggling students with peer tutors. After gaining approval from school officials, Stacey solicited teacher referrals, designed and distributed student sign-up forms, advertised for volunteers, and personally tutored several students.

“People as caring and committed as these young students are critical to the future of our neighborhoods, our cities and our nation,” said Arthur Ryan, chairman and CEO of Prudential. “By recognizing these honorees, we hope to encourage other young people – our future leaders – and all Americans to think more about the value and importance of volunteering in their communities.”

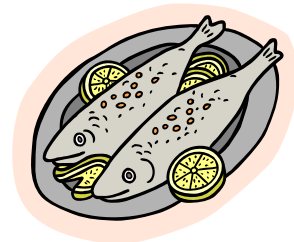
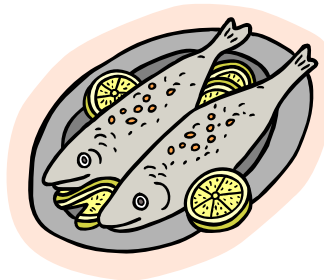
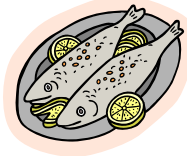
