## Taylor Boys Tennis - Coaches Classic 2007 (Flight F)

Matt Hoiney, first singles player, was seeded number one in the tournament and had a bye the first round. In the second round he had to play Schulte from Harrison in a Pro-Set. He defeated Schulte 8-4 to proceed to the Championship against Downs from Hamilton. Being down 4-1 in the first set, Matt battled back to defeat Downs 7-5 in the first set and ended up winning the second set 6-3 to win the Coaches Classic for first singles.

Ian Sander, 2<sup>nd</sup> singles player, was seeded number one as well in the tournament and also had a bye the first round. In the second round, Ian had to play Price from Harrison in a Pro-Set. He defeated Price 8-5 to move onto the Championship round against Kellerman from Northwest. Being down 4-1 in the first set, Ian battled back to put it in a tie breaker 6-6. Ian won the tie breaker 7-4. In the second set he took control of the set to win it 6-2 and win the Coaches Classic for 2<sup>nd</sup> singles.

Ryan Engels, 3<sup>rd</sup> singles player, was not seeded, and had to play Pro-Set against Butcher from Harrison in the first round. Ryan was down for the majority of the set. Being down 7-5 and Butcher having to only win one more game to win, Ryan fought back to win the match 9-7 to move onto the second round against Lowery from Hamilton who was seeded 2<sup>nd</sup>. Ryan defeated the seeded player in a Pro-Set 8-5 to move onto the Championship round against Thompson from Northwest. Ryan battled hard but lost 4-6 in the first set and 1-6 in the second set. Ryan finished in 2<sup>nd</sup> Place in the Coaches Classic for 3<sup>rd</sup> singles.

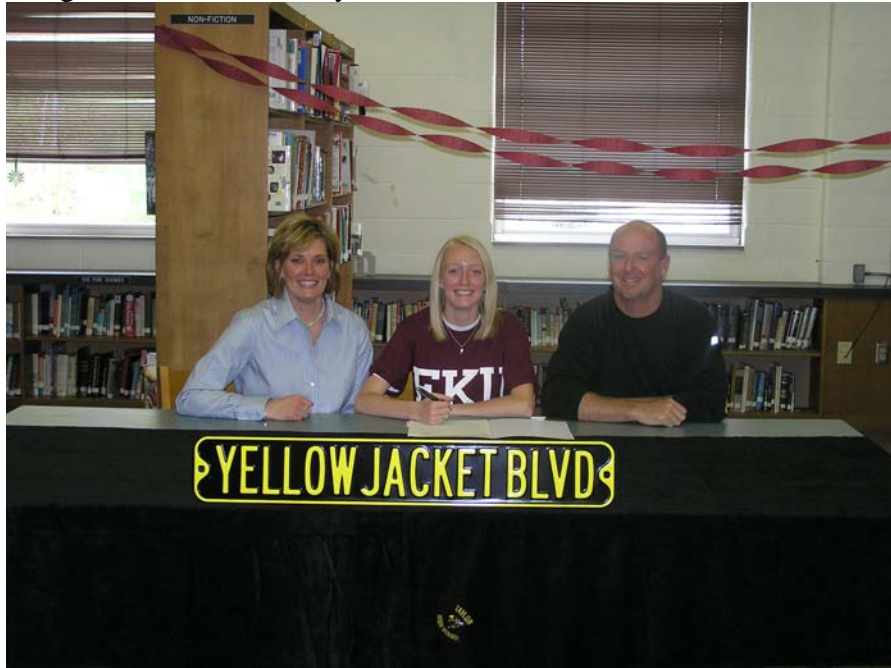
