September 2006 Legislative Report

In Ohio Legislation...

The following legislation has been introduced into the Senate:

- **SB 344, Community Schools**, would clarify that community schools are subject to public audit and would require the Auditor of State to conduct regular audits of community school sponsors and operators.
- **SB 345, Achievement Gap**, would create a task force in each city, exempted village and local school district to develop strategies to close achievement gaps.
- **SB 346, School-Parent Compact**, would require the board of education of each school district to offer a school-parent compact.
- **SB 348, School Facilities**, would create the Rapid Enrollment Growth School Facilities Assistance Program.
- **SB 354, School Performance Ratings**, would eliminate the requirement that a school district or building that fails to make "adequate yearly progress" for more than 2 consecutive years be rated no hire than "in need of continuous improvement" on the annual state academic performance ratings.

In Other Ohio School News...

Ohio Citizens for School Funding Reform is sponsoring "Come Learn About School Funding In Ohio" tomorrow evening, Tuesday, September 12, 2006, in the Milford High School Auditorium at 7:00 p.m. The program will feature guest speakers David Varda and Barbara Shaner of the Ohio Association of School Business Officials. Topics include: ***How much money comes from the state? How much money comes from local property taxes? Why are local school levies needed so often? What is Phantom Revenue? Why has school funding in Ohio been ruled unconstitutional? How can we change school funding in Ohio?*** The Ohio Citizens for School Funding Reform is a parent/community grassroots group whose mission is to raise awareness that change is needed for school funding at the state level.

In Federal Legislation...

- President Bush signed legislation renewing the Carl D. Perkins Vocational and Technical Education Act, renamed the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Improvement Act. Congress approved the legislation, reauthorizing \$1.3 billion in grants for coursework at high schools and community colleges that prepares students for careers that don't require four-year degrees such as welding, business services, and nursing.
- According to a recent poll, the American public believes that public education is the number one issue local leaders should address. The poll was released at the launch of Give Kids Good Schools, a national campaign aimed at helping the public improve America's public schools and achieving the goal of a quality public education for every child in the nation.

Three Rivers Board of Education Meeting – September 11, 2006

- The Department of Education released final regulations for the recently reauthorized Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). The regulations provide guidance for states and schools in how to implement the changes made in the law during reauthorization. Officials from the Education Department say the final regulations do not vary significantly from the draft regulations released a year ago.

- President Bush signed into law the Adam Walsh Child Protection and Safety Act of 2006. The legislation is intended to toughen sentences for child predators and improve the tracking of child sex crime offenders. The legislation requires states to maintain on the Internet publicly accessible registries of offenders. It also directs the Justice Department to maintain a national offender database and to make failure to register a felony. The legislation was signed into law on the 25th anniversary of the abduction of Adam Walsh, the son of *America's Most Wanted* host John Walsh.
