

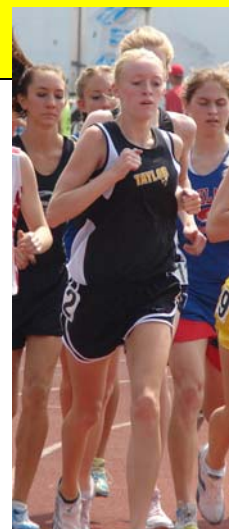

Student named Arts All-Star by the Cincinnati Enquirer

GEORGE CANFIELD, ART



Maybe this is the way all art should happen, accidentally.

George Canfield of Cleves was set on a career as an primary education teacher.

"That was my lifelong goal," says the 19-year-old.

But when he was a junior at Taylor High School, he stepped into Allison Pulskamp's fundamentals of art class.

Next thing you know, he was a senior, and in Pulskamp's senior studio class, he was working seriously on a portfolio.

"She pushed all of us," Canfield says of Pulskamp, whom he clearly admires.

"She steered us toward trying different kinds of art."

He was drawing, experimenting with charcoal and graphite - and getting his classmates to sit for him.

He was painting with oils and oil pastels, and was even dabbling in ceramics by hand-building pieces.

"I like doing it all," he says, but the next second admits to a preference for ceramics. A bowl he made, composed of layers of leaves, won an honorable mention in the annual Scholastic Art and Writing Awards, a nationwide competition that starts at the regional level and moves up from there.

But it was Canfield's startling charcoal figurative drawings that really impressed contest judges. He won a national Silver Award for his portfolio and will be heading to New York City with his father, George, for the awards ceremony Friday at Carnegie Hall.

Classmate Kurtis Penn, another national Silver Award winner for portfolio, will be in New York, too, along with a handful of other area students - and, of course, Pulskamp.

"Out of over 3,000 pieces of artwork only 122 portfolios are chosen on the national level as winners," she points out. "So, for us to have two from a small school like Taylor is absolutely unheard of."

The win literally changed Canfield's life.

Now, he'll be studying to be an art teacher when he attends Northern Kentucky University in the fall.

"All of George's hard work, accompanied by his inherent talent created his portfolio," says Pulskamp. "He never missed a deadline and spent endless hours at home refining each piece. He deserves all of the recognition he has earned."

Meantime, Canfield is working two summer jobs (at Blockbuster and BP), and trying to cope with a setback for his family.

His mother, Carie, 44, had a recent heart attack.

"I've been at the hospital every day since," he said last week, adding that her prognosis looks good.
