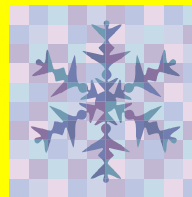

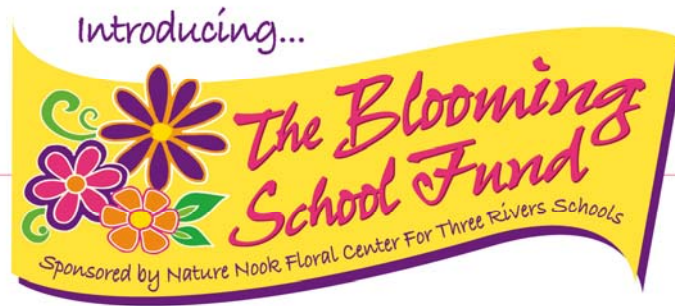

Emergency School Closing Information

When severe weather conditions or other calamities occur, the Superintendent will declare Three Rivers Schools "closed," or "open with limited bus service" and/or "on a one hour delay" or "on a two hour delay."

The decision to close or delay will be made as early as possible (normally by 6:45 a.m.), although there may be occasions when rapidly changing conditions make a late decision necessary. Radio and TV stations generally update information every half hour. **Check our web site's home page for the latest information.**

A one hour delay or a two hour delay may also later be changed to a closed status. A "one hour delay" or a "two hour delay" shall indicate that all buses will pick up students one hour or two hours, respectively, later than normal in all cases, including students being transported to schools in other districts, regardless of whether or not that other district is on a delay.

"Limited bus service" means that some streets are not navigable by school buses and the buses will not pick up on these streets that day: Buffalo Ridge, Silver Creek, Gum Run, Anson, Jordan Hill and Zion Hill.

Morning kindergarten is automatically cancelled when our schools are on a two hour delay.

Dismissal will be at the normal times except as announced, such as when conditions require early dismissal. Depending on whether it is a one or two hour delay, parents may not drop off students at school buildings until one or two hours later than the normal permissible time since there will not be any supervision available. When there is a one or two hour delay, parents should stay tuned to their radios because such a delay might later be changed to a closed status. **We suggest checking our web site** and listening to WCKY (550 kHz), WLW (700 kHz), WEBN, Mix9, KISS FM and FOX 92.5. We also call WLW television.
