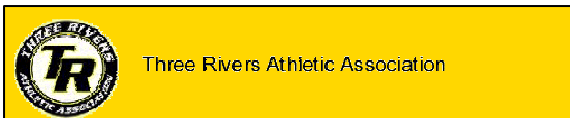

The National Merit® Scholarship Program is an academic competition for recognition and scholarships that began in 1955. High school students enter the National Merit Program by taking the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test—a test which serves as an initial screen of approximately 1.5 million entrants each year—and by meeting published program entry/participation requirements.

In addition to her academic achievements, Aislyn is involved in many programs at THS. She's active in the THS drama and choir as well as the audition-only Cincinnati Honors Choir. Along with her interest in music and theater, Aislyn is a member of Color guard and is committed to finding a college or university that will offer her the opportunity to continue with Color guard. She has narrowed her choices to Earlham College, Indiana University and Miami University where she plans to major in Japanese and Spanish.

BRAD HINES: STATE CHAMPION IN 100 METER BACKSTROKE!



The Swim and Dive team held their districts February 19 at Miami University.

Nathan Meyer placed 4th in diving and moved on to the state meet in Canton last weekend where he finished 9th place at State in diving. He was only ONE point from making the medal stand!

Senior Brad Hines placed 1st in both the 50 freestyle and the 100 backstroke at districts and also went to Canton to compete in the State championships. Last weekend at State he finished 6th in the in the 50 freestyle.

And in the 100 backstroke, Brad is the 2010 STATE CHAMPION (middle left)! It was a come from behind victory in which Brad was in 2nd going into the last lap and then took over the lead with about 7 yards left to win the state championship. The senior had a time of 51.80 becoming the school's first state swim champ since 2006.

- **2 Proofs of Residency.** Proof of Residency must be presented and approved before a student may start school. (Examples of a Proof of Residency document include;
 - 1st form of proof If you own: A tax bill or mortgage statement.
(Tax information can be found by going to www.hamiltoncountyauditor.org/realestate)
 - 1st form of proof If you rent: A lease agreement or property owner affidavit.
 - 2nd form of proof if you rent or own: A current utility bill.
- Complete Immunization Record. Children who do not meet immunization requirements will not be permitted to attend school.

(You may bring copies of all the requirements and or we can make copies for you at the time of registration. However you **MUST** bring the original BC which will then be returned to you.)

In the event that any one of these documents is not available at the time of registration, please return the necessary documents and completed forms to Miami Heights Elementary as soon as possible thereafter. What is most important is that parents begin the registration process.
