

General Information About Three Rivers Local School District

Schools

Three Rivers Local School District has two elementary schools-- Miami Heights Elementary in Miami Heights serving grades Pre-K, Kindergarten, and grade 1; and Charles T. Young Elementary in Cleves serving grades 2 and 4. Grades 5 through 8 are at Three Rivers Middle School and grades 9 through 12 are at Taylor High School. The District is also an affiliate of Great Oaks Institute of Technology and Career Development and is one of six local districts of Hamilton County Educational Service Center.

Enrollment

Students enrolled in all of the schools are residents of Addyston, Cleves, North Bend and adjoining unincorporated areas of Miami Township in Hamilton County. The current enrollment is approximately 2100 students.

Location and Transportation

The District is approximately fifteen miles from Fountain Square in Cincinnati. It borders the corporation line of Cincinnati on US 50 (along the Ohio River) and is in the extreme southwest corner of the state. I-275 provides convenient access to the greater Cincinnati airport, I-75 north and south, Ronald Reagan Highway and I-74 east and west in Hamilton County.

History

North Bend has a noteworthy historical background, being the home of President William Henry Harrison and the birthplace of his grandson, President Benjamin Harrison. President Harrison's Memorial and Tomb is within walking distance of Taylor High School and overlooks the Ohio River.

Parks

There are two Hamilton County Parks in the Three Rivers district: Shawnee Lookout and Mitchell Memorial Forest. A portion of the Neuman Golf Course is within our district; as well as, Shawnee Lookout Park Golf Course and Aston Oaks Golf Course.

Industry

We are fortunate to be located in an industrial community. Lustran Polymers, Marathon/Ashland Petroleum, Owens-Corning, Reis Trucking, Royster-Clark Nitrogen, Consolidated Grain-North Bend Terminal, Dupont and Cincinnati Gas and Electric (Cinergy) Miami Fort Power Station are some of the businesses located in the District.

Non-Public Schools

There are no non-public schools in the Three Rivers Local School District. Elementary students are bused to our Lady of Visitation, St. Bernard, St. Jude and St. Aloysius on the Ohio elementary schools. Mercy and Elder are the non-public high schools.

Three Rivers Local School District is rated a “Stellar Public School System” by Cincinnati Business Magazine, September 2007.

Taylor High School has been rated an “Excellent” school by the Ohio Department of Education for five consecutive years.

C.T. Young Elementary School was rated an “Excellent” school by the Ohio Department of Education in 2006.

Miami Heights Elementary School has been rated an “Excellent” school by the Ohio Department of Education for two consecutive years.

Three Rivers Middle School and Taylor High School are accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools. Three Rivers Middle School was the first in southwestern Ohio and 13th in Ohio to be accredited (1972). Taylor High School has been accredited since 1965.
