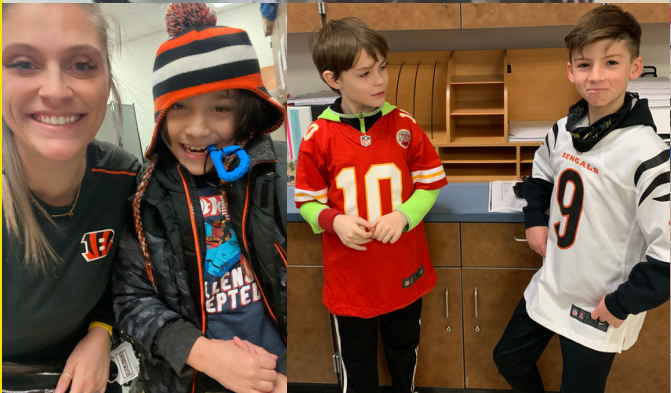

Following the AIME competition, top-scoring students will be invited to compete in the United States of America Mathematical Olympiad (USAMO). USAMO is the world's largest community of mathematicians, students, and enthusiasts. 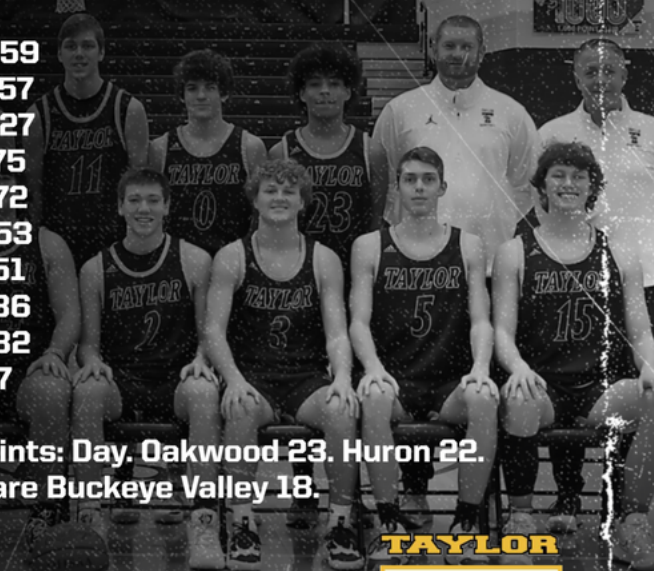

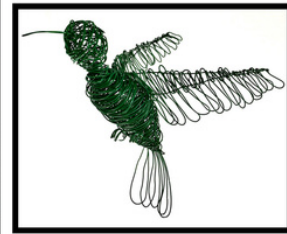

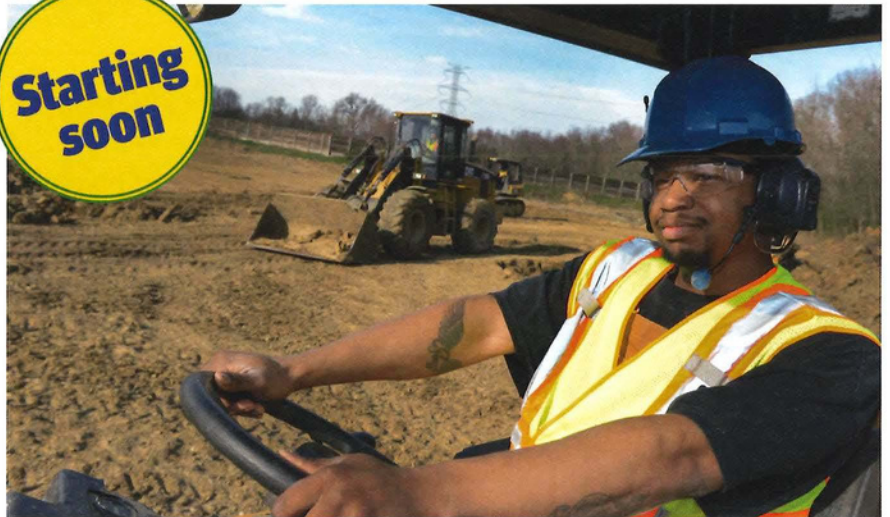
