1) Welcome and Agenda Review

2) HS Exams

- -Last November was the first meeting to discuss changes.
- -If high school is going to give an exam, they are going to give it all students; no exemptions.
- -Previous schedule was a four day window; which stopped learning during those four days.
- -To preserve instructional time, Mr. Smiley proposed a couple of different schedule options to allow more.
- -Calculations for the weight of exams is being revisited.
- -Mr. Smiley spoke with other CHL schools to determine how their exam schedules look.
- -A parent update was sent to all high school parents/families.
- -Benchmark assessments are given twice a year. Aligns with state assessments. The first benchmark shows where the students are academically when they enter the class. The second shows the teacher what interventions are needed.

3) Val/Sal System Update

- -Current 8th graders will be the first grade to not use the val/sal system. Taylor HS will move toward the Latin System.
- -A parent meeting was offered to seventh grade families last year. Information is on the website. Additional communication will follow.
- -This change will allow more student highlights.
- -Annual reminders for all students who will be affected by this change.

4) CKLA updates

- -The first 8 unit materials arrived October 4, 2022
- -Looking into using some student fee funds for workbooks.
- -Elizabeth Sillies is meeting with all teachers to find areas that need support with the new adoption.
- -6, 7, and 8th grade is piloting CKLA currently in ELA classes.
- -5th grade is still using Wonders.

5) Math Adoption

- -High school and Middle school met to discuss
- -Andrea Moore visited other schools to observe instruction.
- -Currently using Every Day Algebra to guide instruction.
- -Looking for a program that aligns all grade levels.
- -Waiting until next school year for a math pilot to avoid math teachers piloting two programs simultaneously.

6) Summer Programs Review

- -2 more summers of the TRLSD Summer program (2023 and 2024)
- -Cut to a half day in 2022
- -More in-house options to help offset the cost.
- -A lot of the outside organizations provided free and reduced prices for their programs.
- -Looking to run a similar schedule for the next two years.

7) Pre-Employment Transition Services & High School brainstorm

- -Maggie Tapia works two days at Taylor HS to help special education students prepare for the future.
- -Mr. Smiley talked about second layers to help students graduate with the proper requirements.

8) Other

-College Board National Recognition Award was given to two Taylor HS Students.
