1) Welcome and Agenda Review

2) Math Adoption Updates

- -PO was placed for middle school programming.
- -Scheduled an inperson trainings (2 days)

3) Summer PD schedules

- -Safe Crisis Management sessions (deescalation/restraint)
- -Anna Chipman is getting Orton-Gillingham trained with Southwest Schools
- -August 8, 9, 10 staff to come in and work on pacing guides, data, etc. (funded through ESSER)

4) August Professional Learning Days

- a) Marlon Styles opening for Certified Staff (see below)
 - -August 11 (all staff): Convocation, breakfast, building PD in the am, and safety PD in the afternoon. E3 training will be offered. Take 10 Training will be offered (CPR/First Aid). Pulse Point new app used for individuals who are fully certified in CPR. ALICE training will be given to staff as well.
 - -The plan is to continue to weave safety into every conversation.
 - -Monday and Tuesday will just be certified staff. Marlon Styles will come in for this PD. He is also going to work with the leadership team. Beginning at 11:30 am, staff will be permitted to work in their rooms and prepare for the upcoming school year.

- -Tuesday is all professional development. Math training will take place on this day. DIBELS training will also be given.
- -\$23,000 Stronger Connections grant to be used for mental health and wellness. Plan to use some on trauma-informed care. Working with Hamilton County and Best Point for this.

5) Jacket Cares: Ready Fest/Wildcat v. Jacket

- -\$7,500 from Crossroads
- -Wildcat vs. Jacket Game: August 18, 2023 Home football game. Both teams will work together to fundraise for Jacket Cares and Wildcats Care.
- -Rolling out payroll deduction again. Explaining to staff how much support Jacket Cares has given to families.

6) Other

- -Summer Programs will most likely continue but when ESSER runs out (2024), there will be a cost to attend. Will need to find new program managers if the camp is offered after 2024.
- -Summer Programs cap at approximately 300 students per week.
- -Scores were shared (preliminary data has been released). Higher than state average in everything but HS Geometry.
