- 1) Welcome and Agenda Review
ODE is now DEW (The Department)
- 2) [Save the Students Act HB 123 & Erin's Law](#)
 - a) Save the Students Act (3 hours of annual instruction)
 - Suicide & Violence Prevention
 - Looking into how we notify our families. There is an opt-out form - will look into putting this form into Final Forms.
 - Every year - Sources of Strength and 7 Mindsets will be used
 - Megan and Lisa will work to get a letter for TRLSD families (December target date).
 - The concern is Tina Cole having enough time to get in the classrooms.
 - Looking into COCA (Council of Child Abuse)
 - Looking into incorporating this into Freshmen Orientation - also considering what Freshmen Orientation looks like in the future to ensure all incoming 9th-graders attend.
 - b) Erin's Law (K-6: 1 hour annually, 7-12: 1 time during this grade span)
 - TRLSD will give the 7-12 requirement in high school
 - Sources of Strength is an approved platform - TRLSD is always using Sources of Strength.

- 3) [HB 33](#)
 - a) Science of Reading Training
 - i) Required stipends
 - this will need to be done on the staff's own time
 - this Law is coming soon
 - b) High-Quality Materials
 - The Department is going to release items that are allowed to be purchased in the spring. Schools will need to ensure they are aligned with these approved materials.
 - c) RIMPS
 - i) Carried over to grades 4-12
 - Looking into what this means for students - do we put everyone 4-12 on a RIMP?
 - ii) High-Dosage tutoring in addition to (30 min 3x per week)
 - TRLSD is already aligned with the necessary 30 min, 3x per week.
 - 4) Math Adoption Updates
 - middle school is doing well with the recent adoption
 - elementary is adapting to the robust curriculum
 - HMH had a presenter come out and coach staff on the curriculum
 - Meeting in December to focus on the pacing guides
 - 5) Professional Learning Days
 - a) BOOST, Into Math, Ohio Writing Project, Trauma Informed Care, Student Teams, Sources of Strengths, Committee Work, PathBlazer
 - Looking into bringing Ohio Writing Project back - was very well received
 - Will now be required to provide training for teachers who have students who have a seizure disorder (law only requires one staff, aside from a nurse, in each building)
 - 6) Hamilton County Health Dept Grant
 - TRLSD received a \$35,000 grant
 - the grant will be used to build resiliency and prove connectedness within the community
 - isolation has been proven to be harmful to people's overall health and wellbeing
 - 7) Other
 - Discussion around a more personalized professional development experience.
