THIS SUMMER

As school districts look to bridge learning gaps that may result from the pandemic, Three Rivers began planning summer opportunities in April. Cleves — In early April, the Three Rivers Board of Education acquired a vacancy as a result of a resignation. The position was posted publicly on the District website for any interested applicants who met the requirements.

After deliberation, the Three Rivers Board of Education collectively agreed to fill the vacancy by recommending Garyne Evans as a new Board Member. Garyne has served on the Board of Education previously, is a parent to two Three Rivers students, and has a robust business background that will add value to the Board of Education's conversations and decision making. On Tuesday, April 27, 2021, the Three Rivers Board of Education unanimously voted Garyne Evans into the role.

Mr. Evans will fill the role as a Three Rivers Board of Education Member through December 31, 2021. In November of 2021, the position will be on the ballot for public election. The individual elected will resume the position beginning January 1, 2022.

Taylor High School introduced Career Academies to its curriculum in 2019 with sixty-four students enrolled. At the time, the class provided opportunities in aviation and pre-apprenticeship electric. Mr. Bryan Kestner, who was then teaching middle school history, was asked to consider taking over the Academy. Mr. Kestner is known for his innovative thinking, passionate teaching, and incredible skills that provide support to students in a wide variety of various trades. After consideration, Bryan agreed to this opportunity and immediately hit the ground running with ideas. Within the first week, Bryan had a logo to enhance the brand of the Taylor High School Career Academies as well as a long list of possibilities for ways to increase the program in order to best support more student interest.

Currently, the Taylor High School Career Academies serves over one hundred students and has over two hundred already enrolled for the 2021-2022 school year.

One of the most interesting classes offered during 2020-2021 was the Passion Project. In this course, seven students spent the year focusing on a passion of their choice. Student passions consisted of baking, art, automating simple tasks, fashion design, personal training, and animation. Students engaged in their passion projects throughout the year. Additionally, the students created videos of them explaining their purpose for the project as well as an end-of-year video sharing what they learned from the project and the final outcome. Students in the program also presented to an audience at an evening event on campus to explain the entire process of the Passion Project. Each student explained something they learned throughout the year as well as how they grew as a person from the experience.

At Three Rivers Local School District students are encouraged to find their strengths and interests and use them to make a personalized path for their future. Opportunities through a variety of trades are a fantastic option for many students. A community member saw the need for more students entering the trades after high school and created the Courter Trade Scholarship. The Scholarship is for residents of the Three Rivers Local School District interested in attending accredited trade schools to become part of the skilled trade occupations. Between the Scholarship opportunity and THS Career Academies, students can graduate from Taylor High School set to begin working in a successful career.

As the program continues to gain momentum, Mr. Kestner works to grow opportunities for students. In May of 2021, Mr. Kestner held a luncheon where approximately fifteen people from businesses around our community attended that all specialized in different trades; including plumbing, real estate, landscaping, and more. Mr. Kestner is committed to not only sustaining these current partnerships but also accumulating more as the program grows. He is dedicated to providing as many opportunities as possible for all students interested in the trades.

In 2021-2022, Career Academy students will be offered three new courses: Aviation 301, Home 101, and Rise Up. Aviation 301 has our students going to Cincinnati State's West campus to increase their knowledge of drones. Home 101 is an opportunity for students to learn hands-on skills and knowledge for all-around-the-home projects. Rise Up is a course selection that focuses on customer service skills and soft skills to prepare them for employment. With a variety of new options being considered in the Career Academies, the program will undoubtedly continue to strengthen, attract more students, and provide all graduates with a path to a successful career.

THREE RIVERS AWARDED FOR OUTSTANDING FINANCIAL REPORTING

Ashburn, VA - 2021 - The Association of School Business Officials International (ASBO) is pleased to award Three Rivers Local School District the Certificate of Excellence in Financial Reporting (COE). ASBO International's COE recognizes districts that have met the program's high standards for financial reporting and transparency. The school district earned the Certificate of Excellence for its Comprehensive Annual Financial Report for the fiscal year ended 2020.

"The COE's mission is to promote and recognize excellence in financial reporting," ASBO International Executive Director David Lewis says. "The Comprehensive Annual Financial Report informs stakeholders about the financial and economic state of the district, making it an important communications tool for building trust and engaging with the school community."

By participating in the COE program, school districts demonstrate their commitment to financial transparency. Applicants submit their report for review by a team of financial professionals who provide feedback to improve future documents. If the report meets the requirements of the program, it may receive the Certificate of Excellence. A district's participation in the COE program can facilitate bond rating and continuing bond disclosure processes. The COE is proudly sponsored by ASBO International Strategic Partner American Fidelity.

EMERGENCY BROADBAND BENEFIT

The FCC has launched a temporary program to help families and households struggling to afford internet service during the COVID-19 pandemic. The Emergency Broadband Benefit provides a discount of up to \$50 per month toward broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers. Among other eligible statuses, all students who qualify for the Federal Free and Reduced Lunch Program, as well as all students in a Community Eligibility Provision school, are eligible for the benefit. Eligible households can enroll through a participating broadband provider or directly with the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) using an online or mail-in application. You can learn more about the benefit, including eligibility and enrollment information, by visiting www.fcc.gov/broadbandbenefit, or by calling 833-511-0311. Families seeking assistance can also contact the RemotEDx Connectivity Champions who will guide families through the application process. Emergency Broadband Benefit

What is it?

The Emergency Broadband Benefit is a temporary FCC program to help households struggling to afford internet service during the pandemic. The benefit provides:

- Up to \$50/month discount for broadband
- Up to \$75/month discount for households on
- qualifying Tribal lands; and
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet purchased through a participating provider.

Who is eligible?

A household is eligible if one member of the household:

- Has an income that is at or below 135% of the Federal Poverty Guide lines or participates in certain government assistance programs;
- Receives benefits under the free and reduced-price school lunch or breakfast program
- Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year; Experienced a substantial loss of income due to job
- loss or furlough since February 29, 2020; or
- · Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating provider's existing low-income or COVID-19 program


TAYLOR ALUMNA ILLUSTRATES PUBLISHED BOOK

The history of the Mother's Day Tea as explained by former teacher, Mrs. Thomson



Many know that 3rd grade Mother's Day Tea is a tradition that has been kept for many years at Three Rivers. However, few know how it all began. Recently, former teacher, Susan Thomson took the time to write about The Untold Tale of the Mother's Day Tea.

In the book, Mrs. Thomson explains that while at Miami Heights, students in third grade began writing prompts in May that had students reflect on the progress they had made throughout the year. Because the writing process was time-consuming and strenuous, after students completed their work, they were able to work on a garden. The indoor gardens were the size of the students' desks and contained miniature decorations and real flowers. Since this work coincided with spring, moms were invited to the school for what was then called the Third Grade Garden Party to celebrate Mother's Day. During the event, students read their compositions and explained how their garden was made. When all students had an opportunity to share, everyone would go out to the garden tent to enjoy cookies with tea and a square dance. This event then grew to be called Mother's Day Tea.

Some traditions have changed through the years, but Mother's Day Tea still occurs annually. Although this year's celebration is not in-person, the staff has worked hard to ensure as much of its tradition is carried on nonetheless. Three Rivers greatly appreciates the time and detail Mrs. Thomson put into the explanation of how this wonderful event began. She ended her book by stating, "Wishing all the Three Rivers students and moms continued enjoyment at The Mother's Day Tea. May you cherish it every bit as much as those who first celebrated The Garden Party long, long ago!"
