Students entering kindergarten at Three Rivers must be 5 years of age by August 1st. Three Rivers Elementary is excited to welcome you to the 2020-2021 Kindergarten Registration Event on March 14th anytime between 9:00 am and 1:00 pm (we suggest coming before 12:30 pm to allow time for registration and a tour) at our Educational Campus. This is an opportunity for parents and incoming kindergarten students to come and get to know the building, receive pertinent information about July academic screenings, ask questions, take a tour of the building, meet Principal Biedenbach, and get your child registered for next school year! To help streamline the kindergarten registration process, parents are encouraged to sign up online at https://taylor-

oh.finalforms.com/students starting March 11th before coming to the registration event. Staff and computers will be available on March 14thto assist and help parents navigate the online registration system and answer any questions they have about the forms. If you are unable to attend this event and need assistance with registering your child, please call our school office (513-467-3210). Three Rivers uses an online registration process. This system allows us to go paperless, while enabling you to complete your child's full registration only once for as long as they attend Three Rivers; giving parents the ability to update it at any time during the school year(s). The forms you will see in the online registration process include: Registration, Emergency Medical Authorization, Transportation, Technology, Affidavits (current residence, landlord, and prior residency) and Ohio School Health History. Choosing your child's education is the most important and difficult decision parents make and we THANK YOU for choosing Three Rivers Local School District. Please note that a notary will be on-site March 14th from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm. If you need this service, please arrive before noon.

Understanding MAP

Measures of Academic Growth

What is MAP?

Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) is a computerized assessment that provides educators with the information they need to improve teaching and learning. Educators use the growth and achievement data from MAP to develop targeted instructional strategies.

What are RIT scores?

Student MAP results are reported as RIT scores (short for Rasch Unit). The RIT score is simply an estimate of a student's instructional level and it also measures student progress, or growth, in school. Similar to a growth chart that measures height and weight, a MAP score can show how much a student has grown from year to year. RIT scores enable teachers to pinpoint what students already know and what they are ready to learn.

How is the RIT score helpful?

RIT scores are measured on an equal-interval scale. This means that the difference between scores (like inches) is the same even if a student scores high or low. For example, a 2nd grader that gets a score of 211 and a 5th grader that gets a score of 211 are both learning at a similar level. RIT scores are expected to increase over time. However, the younger the child, the greater the RIT growth since overall growth is smaller as questions get harder at higher levels. Students who test above the expected level also show less growth. Growth rates are estimated as typical growth not expected growth. RIT scores are more valuable as you look at measuring student learning in growth over time rather than as an isolated RIT score.

How are teachers using this information?

Teachers are utilizing student scores to make data-based decisions to improve student achievement. MAP scores are just one piece of data teachers use to inform instruction. Our goal is for teachers to adjust instruction so that ALL students grow at levels appropriate for each student.

What is my part as a parent or guardian?

Parents and guardians should become comfortable in understanding that students will grow at different rates and at different times. A multi-year picture of your child's growth will give you a more accurate understanding of your child's learning progress.
