Our Classroom

- Purpose is to serve students with special needs
- We are an integrated preschool program serving both children identified with special education needs and children that are typically developing.
- Licensed by the Ohio
 Department of Education
- 5 Stars Step up to Quality Rating



- 2 Sessions, 4 days per week
- Morning
 - o 9:00am 11:45am
- Afternoon
 - o 12:45pm 3:30pm
- Mixture of 3, 4, and 5 yr olds
 - We will select a
 combination of 3 and 4
 year olds and try to keep
 the boy and girl ratio as
 even as possible.
- 16 total students per session
 - 8 typically developing
 - 8 special needs

Classroomstaff

- Each classroom has one dual licensed teacher and one educational assistant to serve all students
- Additional educational assistants to assist students 1:1 and who have more significant needs
- Specialists: PT, OT, SLP who provide group and individual therapy sessions and interventions
- School Psychologist for assessments

Step up to Quality 5 Star Program





- <u>Step Up To Quality</u> is a five-star quality rating and improvement system administered by the Ohio Department of Education and the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services.
- SUTQ recognizes and promotes learning and development programs that meet quality program standards that exceed preschool licensing and school age child care licensing health and safety regulations.
- Step Up To Quality program standards are based on national research identifying standards which lead to improved outcomes for children.
- Teacher and educational assistants participate in at least 16 hours of professional development each year.


Curriculum & Assessment

- Creative Curriculum is a comprehensive, research-based curriculum that promotes exploration and discovery as a way of learning, enabling children to develop confidence, creativity, and lifelong critical thinking skills.
- We work closely with Hamilton County Education Service Center (HCESC) and their early childhood department to develop units and get materials.
- We alter curriculum every year, so students who attend multiple years are engaged and not repeating the same units year after year.

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assessment

- Early Learning Assessment is required by the state to be given twice a year.
 - The assessment is designed to aid teachers in determining where children are in their readiness for kindergarten. The assessment focuses on seven areas of a child's growth and development:
 - Social Foundations (including social and emotional development, and approaches toward learning)
 - Mathematics
 - Science
 - Social Studies
 - Language and Literacy
 - Physical well-being and motor development
 - Fine Arts

 - Typically 1 week after the first student day for K-12
- First week individual visits
 - Complete paperwork, screening, acclimate child to classroom
- By the end of July families will receive an information packet
 - Complete Final Forms online
 - Must turn in all forms to office Birth certificate, Medical forms from doctor, & notarized residency form.

Lottery Registration

- Limited amount of spots for the 2021-22 school year
 - o 50% is reserved to serve students with special needs
- To determine acceptance, we will be conducting lotteries based on various factors that help create a diverse preschool classroom.
 - Age (1-2 years preschool), gender, siblings of previous students, & staff members who live within the district.
- Due to the limited number of spots, all students must live in the Three Rivers Local School District to be considered for our preschool program. Open Enrollment does not pertain to the Three Rivers Preschool.
