College Credit Plus Next Steps 2020-2021

- Submit signed Letter of Intent & Student Responsibility Form by April 1st to your school counselor. These are non binding agreements but must be submitted by the deadline to be eligible for CCP.
- Determine what school you want to apply to for CCP. Each school has different admission requirements & processes. You can find out about these on the school's website.
- Complete all application documents for the school you choose. These are most likely on the school's website. There may be additional documents required to be completed by your school counselor so make sure to check and give these to your counselor with plenty of time to spare.
- Complete all admission testing for the school of your choice. If your school requires the ACT or SAT, make sure to send your scores directly from the testing agency. This can be done by going to the ACT or SAT website, send my scores, looking up the college's code, and paying the fee. THS is offering the Accuptacer for Cincinnati State on 4/21. Any student who needs to take the test but misses this date must sign up for the placement test on their own time with the college.
- Some admission testing requires you to take them on campus. The college's website should have this information. You can use a college visit day to do this. You must complete the college visit day form and submit it to the main office at least 48 hours in advance for it to be excused.
- Meet all deadlines for admission set by the college. These will be different depending on what term you would like to start.
- Follow all instructions given by the college after submitting your application.
 Please note that once admitted, the colleges will communicate with you using the college email they assign. It is very important to check this email regularly.
- You will most likely have to attend an orientation. This event will give you general information as well as registration information. In most cases, this is mandatory.

- You will have to meet with an advisor from the college. This is a time you should ask all of your questions regarding the program and any courses you would like to take. It is especially important to ask about transfer credit if you plan on attending another college.
- Once you schedule your classes, you will need to send a copy of your official schedule to your counselor. If you are taking a hybrid schedule of both CCP & high school classes, your high school counselor will work with you to create a schedule that fits both the classes you want at Taylor and the classes you are taking in college. We recognize that changes may need to be made to your requests based on the logistics of your college classes and this is permitted.
- The process for obtaining your books & materials is different for each school. Information will be provided to you from the school via email communication & at orientation. It is your responsibility to obtain these books. Books & materials are free of charge per the CCP program.
- You are responsible for all work in your college classes and all communication with your professor and school. You should make every effort to do your best. If you drop a class after certain deadlines or fail the course, you will be responsible for the cost of that course.
- If you need a course for high school sport's eligibility, you must self report those grades to the counseling office. This is the student's responsibility.

For students taking in house CCP classes offered at Taylor

- □ You must apply to the college offering the course and follow all admission criteria.
- You must be accepted into the program to take for college credit. Students not taking the course for college credit are permitted to be in the same course as students taking it for dual credit.
- □ You must meet all deadlines set by the college to be considered for admission.
- Take appropriate admission testing if you do not have the ACT or SAT score to qualify.
- If your student is a junior, they can use the ACT score they will take in March. If the score does not meet the college's admission standards, they will have to take the Accuplacer. The student must communicate the need to do this with their high school counselor prior to May 1st.
- If your student is a 9th or 10th grade student, they must take the Accuplacer offered at Taylor High School for that college. The dates for these will be in late March and will be

communicated soon once the college approves. If your student misses this testing date, it is their responsibility to set this up with their high school counselor.

How do I know what classes to take?

We suggest working your way backward from what you want to study in college. Almost all schools have a curriculum for each academic area listed on the website.

Determine what general education classes you will need to take for that major. Then find a college that would offer those exact classes or classes that are similar and would transfer.

Almost all schools have a course catalog listed on the website where you can determine what the school offers as far courses. There are limitations to course levels that CCP students can take. For full information, you should contact the CCP department of that university.

Which school should I choose?

This is entirely up to you. Every public university in Ohio legally has to have a CCP program. They may call it something differently but generally if you google that school's name and College Credit Plus, you will find the information easily.

If possible, take classes at the school you plan to attend. If this isn't possible because of admissions requirements or your school is something other than an Ohio public school- take classes that will transfer to the school of your choice.

If you are wondering if a course will transfer, you can call admissions at the university of your choice. Present to them the course name, code, and credit hours and they will be able to tell you if that course transfers over.

- □ MAT 153 (Pre Calculus) 6 credit hours, Cincinnati State
