

SENIOR BREAKFAST



Senior breakfast is the last day for seniors and an opportunity for the class to be together for their final hours at Taylor. The breakfast will take place in the High School Cafeteria. Seniors will be dismissed for the day after a brief meeting following breakfast at approximately 10:00 AM.

COMMENCEMENT PRACTICE



All seniors participating in commencement must attend the rehearsal on May 26th. Students must arrive at Taylor High School no later than 9:15 AM to be bussed to the Cintas Center. Buses will leave campus promptly at 9:30 am. **Please note: students who do not attend Commencement Practice will not be permitted to participate in the ceremony.

COMMENCEMENT CEREMONY



Seniors, and guests are invited to attend the Commencement Ceremony of the Taylor High School Class of 2021 to celebrate our students' success. The ceremony will include student speeches, a graduation address from our Superintendent, and the presentation of diplomas.

COMMENCEMENT INFORMATION

- The Taylor High School commencement ceremony will be conducted with dignity and respect. Graduates, parents, and guests are reminded that Commencement is a formal ceremony.
- The Cintas Center will open at 6:00 PM. Those arriving earlier than 6:00 PM will have to wait outside of the Entrance. Seats will be reserved by tickets (additional information forthcoming). Students are required to be in their holding room in the Cintas Center by 6:30 PM. Guests attending the ceremony must be seated by 6:55 PM. Anyone arriving after 6:55 PM may be required to wait until an escort is able to guide them to an open seat as to not disturb the program.
- The Cintas Center is handicap accessible. Seating arrangements will be available for handicapped guests in wheelchairs and one accompanying person. Ushers will be available to assist you.

PICK UP

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

STORAGE

It is recommended that graduates not bring purses or any other valuable items to the holding rooms—those rooms will not be locked or supervised during the ceremony.

BEHAVIOR DURING CEREMONY

Any student, senior or underclassman, who disrupts the commencement ceremony will still be subject to disciplinary action including, but not limited to, withholding the student's diploma until prescribed consequences are satisfied

BEHAVIOR @ SCHOOL

Any senior who disrupts or contributes to the disruption of school during the final days of the school year will be subject to disciplinary action including, but not limited to, being denied participation in commencement

NOT PARTICIPATING?

Any graduate choosing not to participate in commencement should notify Mrs. Rueve by May 14th. Diplomas for students not attending the ceremony may be picked up at the High School Main Office beginning Monday, June 7, provided their fees are paid in full.
