Who is on the Jacket Cares Team?

Counselors, administrators, school psychologists, nursing staff, and teachers work together to create and distribute resources that our students and families need to be successful.

With intentional thought and purpose, the Jacket Cares Team takes into consideration the social, emotional, and physical needs of our students. We partner with local organizations to provide direct resources.



Jacket Cares is available to every student and teacher in the Three Rivers District. Funds may be used for anything that directly impacts the social and emotional health of students and staff. Examples of this include...

- **Crisis Intervention Response Team** In response to a traumatic event experienced by a Three Rivers family such as loss of a parent or student.
 - Flowers or gifts sent by the district to the family.
 - Clothing for students who need to attend a funeral.
 - Gift cards to the family to provide assistance during a crisis.
- Basic Needs Resources
 - Winter Clothing for students
 - Back to School Supplies
 - Toiletries, Food, Gas Cards






We need more.






Percentage of Students Who Improve with the Addition of an SEL Program


Taylor High School Student Data

- Of the high school students surveyed....
- 25% of students are stating that they need direct assistance with their mental health.
- 8% are saying they do not have their basic needs met.
- Nearly 20% of those surveyed state that they do not like who they are as a person.
- 25% of students are not comfortable asking someone for help.

How is funding distributed from Jacket Cares?
