When reflecting on the compliment he received for this decision, Mr. Biedenbach mirrored Mr. Banchy in his response as well. "Our goal is, and always has been, for all students to have as normal of a school day as possible with their peers and the education they receive," he stated with fidelity.

The Children's Home of Cincinnati will continue their building tours and conversations with staff to have an ever-changing and ever-improving model that continues to service students and their families to the best of their ability. When commenting on the most recent restructuring of the

organization, Mr. Banchy stated, "I don't ever want to do something for the 'business model'; I want to do it for the improvement of all kids."
